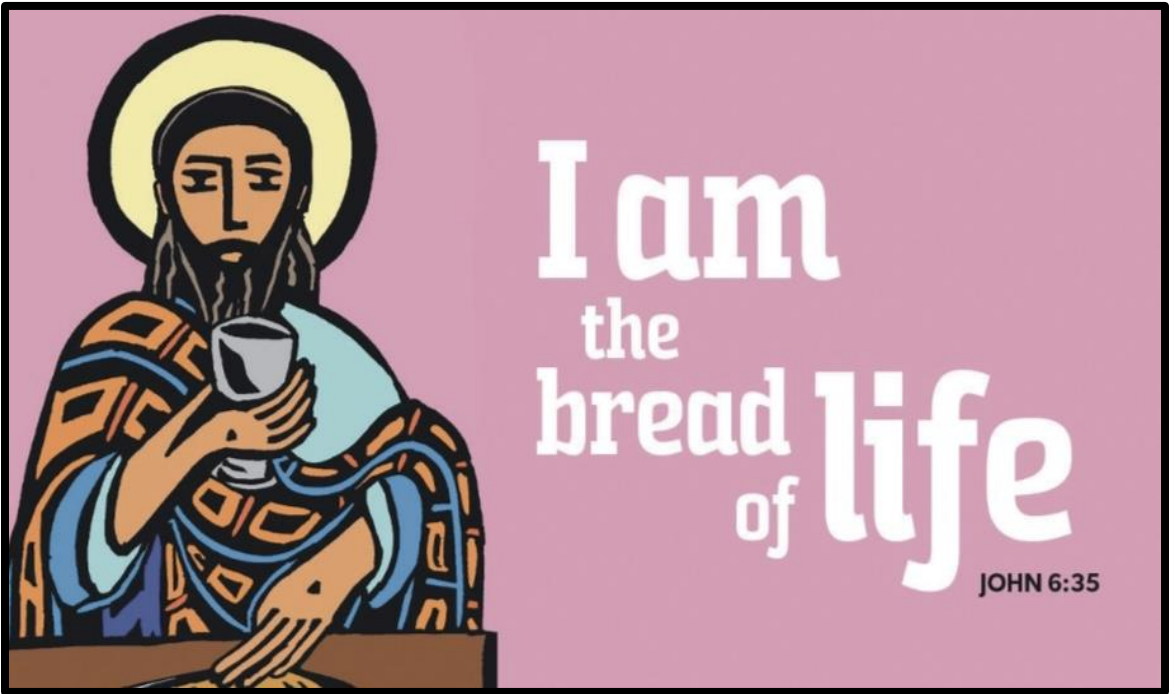

MESSAGE

1. "**Stellvertretung**" means "representation" or "substitution," where one person stands in for or represents another.

2. Dietrich Bonhoeffer used this idea to describe how Jesus represents all people by sharing in their suffering and experiences.

3. Bonhoeffer saw Jesus as someone who stands in for humanity, experiencing our struggles and showing how to live with empathy and love.

4. This idea of "**Stellvertretung**" helped Bonhoeffer understand how Christians should act with compassion and righteousness, especially towards the marginalized

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER & WORDS OF INSTITUTION

- P: Holy God, you alone are holy, you alone are God. The universe declares your praise beyond the stars, beneath the sea, within each cell, with every breath.

C: **We praise you, O God.**

- P: Generations bless your faithfulness through the water, by night and day, across the wilderness, out of exile, into the future.

C: **We bless you, O God.**

- P: We give you thanks for your dear Son at the heart of human life, near to those who suffer, beside the sinner, among the poor, with us now.

C: **We thank you, O God.**

- P: In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Remembering his love for us on the way, at the table, and to the end, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

For those not able to have red wine, there is grape juice in the outer circle of every tray. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers will say: "The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you," to which you may respond: "Amen."

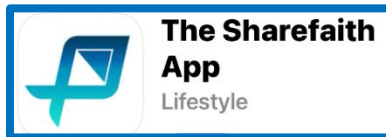
